

PSIR I Course Syllabus

Description

Administered through live, one-on-one tutoring, the PSIR Level I course allows participants to prove report-writing skills through a combination of reading, testing and hands-on report-writing exercises.

The course does more than simply require participants to read text, take tests and write test reports: It challenges them to envision incidents as they occur in the real world of private security enforcement; prepares them with the mindset to properly react to incidents; and, endows them with the foundational strategies of preparing to write a complete report -- before ever picking up a pen or accessing a keyboard.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, the participant should:

Know the foundational components of a complete incident report narrative;

Understand the necessity of objective writing;

Possess basic knowledge of the PSIR standards of sequence, description, classification and attribution;

Develop familiarity with narrative construction protocols and best practices; and,

Practice basic risk avoidance strategies to minimize the possibility of grammatical error.

Requirements

To earn a PSIR I certification the participant must submit seven reviewed writing assignments, two reviewed editing assignments, nine unit tests, complete a 50-question final exam with a score of 85% or higher and develop a capstone report.

Level

This is a basic, first-level course; it is suitable for all participants.

Administration

Participants are assigned to an individual, one-on-one tutor. The tutor reviews submitted assignments and issues the PSIR I certificate.

Verification

Upon completion of the course, the participant receives a digital key. The key unlocks the official verification of certification and enables third-party verification.
